<b>HOLLY COUNCIL</b>

Shall section 6.4 of the Village Charter, which states The Council shall provide by resolution for the time and place of its regular meetings and shall hold at least two (2) regular meetings each month, excepting the months of November and December, in which at least one (1) meeting shall be held; be amended to read as follows:

6.4 Meetings of the Council.

The Council shall provide by resolution for the time and place of its regular meetings and shall hold at least twelve (12) regular meetings during the fiscal year.
