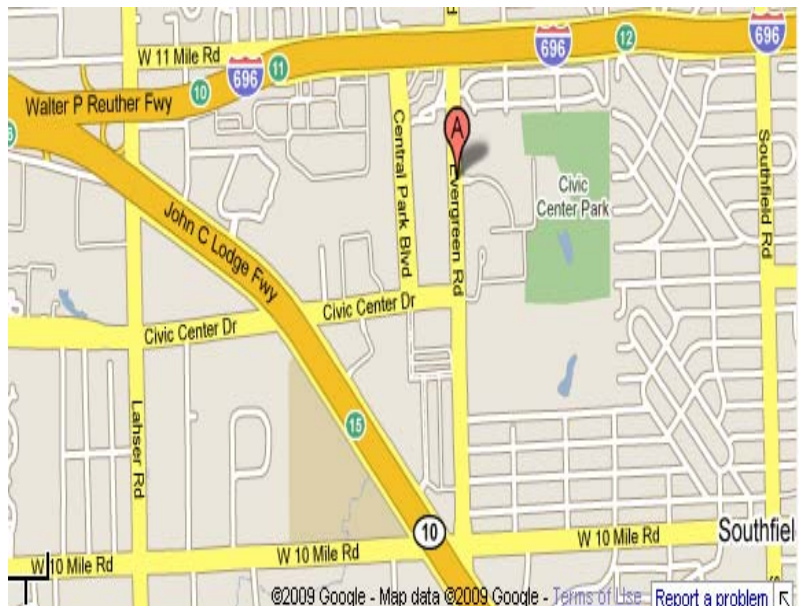
Program:

*Outcomes research studies the effects of particular health care practices and interventions on patients’ health and quality of life. Did you see the PBS Special on the National Parks?

The theme was that the National Parks are "America's best idea" but that to keep them for the benefit of all Americans is a perpetual struggle.
